



This month's block is an easy, fun, and modern-looking one called "Falling Triangles" from the Missouri Star Quilt Company (see link below). We've chosen to use Thirties fabrics and unbleached muslin for a cheery look.

The instructions will create 4 blocks. Do NOT sew them together – keep them separate so that the block winners can create their own varied designs.

You will receive one BOM drawing ticket for each of the 4 blocks! 😊

Finished block size:

Block size: 8-1/4" finished, 8-3/4" unfinished.

Fabric:

- Unbleached muslin background:
 - (1) 10" square
 - (4) 2 1/2" x 6 3/4" rectangles
 - (4) 2 1/2" x 8 3/4" rectangles
- Thirties reproduction fabric: (1) 10" square

Start by sewing 4 half-square triangles:

1. Put the 10" squares of your background and print fabrics right sides together.
2. Sew around the entire outside edge of the square using a 1/4" seam.
3. Laying your ruler *diagonally* from corner to corner, cut across the square in both directions.
4. Open the (4) half-square triangles you've created, press toward the dark fabric, and trim any "bunny ears."

Then, for each of the four half-square triangles: sew the muslin rectangles to the print sides of the half-square triangle unit:

5. Sew a 2 1/2" x 6 3/4" rectangle to one of the print sides of each triangle unit.



6. Sew a 2 1/2" x 8 3/4" rectangle to the other print side of each triangle unit.



7. When done, trim any excess background fabric so that your block measures 8 3/4" square. **Do not sew the blocks together.**
