From cutting and sewing posture to stretches designed to be done at your sewing table using equipment and tools you already have, Rose will share her expertise that will help ease the toll hours spent quilting can have on our bodies. 





March 1, 2021 (by Zoom)
Board Meeting Minutes

The Board meeting was called to order at 6:32 p.m. Board members in attendance were: President Linda Lampson, Vice-President Pam Brown, Treasurer Michelle Crosbie and Secretary Dawn Gutsch.

In addition, the following coordinators and co-chairs were present: Cyndi Cunningham, Miriam Marlin, Patricia Bernard, Donna Poe, Patricia Bauer, Trina Jahnsen, Teresa Lewis, Karen Derrick, Kathy Vedder, Marilyn Lira, Jeanne Nelson, Gina Stateler-Calhoun, Norma Jean Edwards, Karen Perlis and Karen Bolan. A quorum was present.

The Board appointed Dawn Gutsch as Secretary.

Marilyn Lira moved that the January Board meeting minutes, as published in the Patchwords newsletter be approved. Kathy Vedder seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.

Reports:

President's Report: Linda Lampson, Explained that the Global Quilt Connection is a good resource for the guild and guild leaders.

Vice President's Report: Pam Brown, Nothing to report.

Treasurer's Report: Michelle Crosbie, Nothing to report.

Membership: Kathy Vedder reported that we have one person who may be joining soon, other than that there is no change.

Programs:

- a. Linda Lampson explained and proposed the use of Global Quilt Connection (GQC). On May 22 and May 23 GQC will have 18 different teachers giving 15- minute lessons. All guild members can access for one \$50 fee. Teresa Lewis will sign the guild up and members can drop in & out of the event as they want, you do not need to stay for the whole time. The event runs from 12:00-3:00 Pacific time, both days.
- b. Linda proposed adding responsibility for monitoring and getting content from GQC to Program and President duties.
- c. Continuing in Zoom beyond COVID. We discussed the possibility of continuing Zoom meetings after COVID restrictions are lifted. A lot of good information is provided by speakers, members who have moved away from the area are able to continue with meetings, and we may be able to work with presenters who live far away without flying them in. Many presenters like doing the lecture part of their presentations via zoom and they would like to continue in this format if possible. Some presenters are willing to book as a Zoom but willing to change to in person when the time comes. We will discuss this more when we can start planning for in person meetings.
- d. No fabric sale in April, we will have a presenter and Sewcial instead. Teresa Lewis has a presenter who is willing to do a presentation, \$45, short program followed by a Sewcial. Teresa Lewis will set it up.

Community Quilts: Marilyn Lira made a motion, requesting approval of a one-time donation of 50 of 131 quilts we have in storage be given to the Santa Rosa Community Health Center. Gina Statler-Calhoun seconded the motion. There were no objections. Linda will recommend the motion to the guild at next business meeting.

Website:

- a. Karen Derrick reported that when people book online there are still fees charged to book workshops. The Board discussed whether we should absorb the fees as a cost of doing business or do we want to raise the price of the classes slightly to offset the cost. It was decided that the guild will absorb the fees at this time.
- b. It was suggested that we specify terms and conditions when people sign up for classes. This would include stating cancellation fees, if refunds are given and other policies. Cyndi Cunningham will go through the program book to see if there is any guidance in it and we will continue the discussion at the next Board meeting.
- c. Karen Derrick suggested requiring non-guild-members to book workshops by giving Michelle credit card information directly rather than allowing them to book online or do we optimize online workshop sign-ups for guild members first. After discussion it was decided to review this at Wednesday's business meeting.

Nominating committee:

- a. President Lampson is seeking volunteers for the nominating committee.
- b. President Lampson wants the Board to consider adding a President Elect position to the Board. The current VP position does not require the person to automatically step into the president position. Right now the VP position, president, and past president require a 3-year commitment. We need to determine if the president elect would be in addition to the VP. We need to determine the tasks/responsibilities are of the VP vs. president elect. We will need to have further discussion on this. This change may require a constitutional amendment.

Opportunity Quilt:

- a. Marketing – Karen Derrick reported that the quilt has been at Village Sewing Center (VSC) for 4 months and \$170 in tickets were sold. The quilt is going to BOLT in Cloverdale on Tuesday, March 2nd. It will stay at BOLT for a couple of months. Karen will look into other venues where we may be able to take the quilt. Karen will provide a bag to VSC for those who need to turn in or [??] raffle tickets.
- b. Next year's quilt – Karen Bolan presented two options for the Board to choose between for the next opportunity quilt. Karen made a motion to approve the selected design, this was seconded by Marilyn Lira and approved by the Board. Karen will reveal the pattern after June 2022, when the current quilt is scheduled to be auctioned.

Other: Marilyn Lira brought forward that Rhonda Denny would like to know if she can post her patterns on our web site? It was decided that a link to Ronda's page will be posted instead of her patterns, this was approved by the Board.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:16 p.m. The next board meeting will be on Monday, May 3, 2021.

Guest Speaker: Cindy McChesney who is the instructor for Panel Palooza. She gave an overview of her workshop which will cover how to work with panels in quilting.
