Quilter of the Month

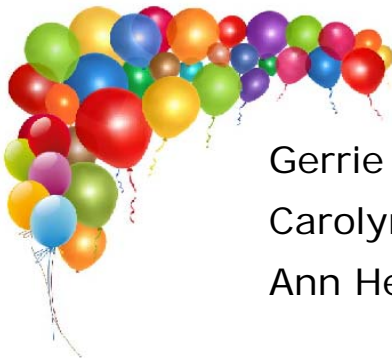
I am Carole Dehlinger and am honored to be Quilter of the Month, and look forward to sharing my quilts with you at the November 2nd meeting.

I started sewing in grade school and embroidering cross-stitch pillow cases. But after a summer school class as a sophomore, sewing construction was fun! (J.C. Penny's 25 cents a yard fabric!).

But recalling those early years, I realize that none of my good friends and later, no roommates sewed, embroidered or knitted. It seems odd now. This was true for over a decade. In my mid-twenties, through SRJC, I took a quilt class taught by prominent quilt historian Joyce Gross. My first opportunity to see beautiful handwork.

In the early 80's through a patchwork class at Whaley's in Sebastopol, I met many sewers and quilters. Hooray! Those were the days of no rotary cutters or quilt rulers and array of homemade template materials. Blocks were machine-pieced and many quilts were hand quilted. Today, I machine piece quilts, occasionally hand quilt, but mainly quilt by machine, and always hand appliqué. Those of you who hand-piece and hand quilt deserve extra credit and gold stars!

The best thing about the quilt world is the generosity-the sharing of techniques, fabrics and stories. Also, we no longer "need" to make quilts as was true 200 years ago, but we still quilt with love.
