"Ten years ago, I inherited my grandma's simple Singer sewing machine and I adopted the phrase "there's no crying in quilting". I started my adventure in quilting using black thread on cheap yellow fabric.

In 2017, when my family home burned, quilting became a part of my life's therapy and creative outlet, some taking 400 plus hours to make. I have done my best work since then. My heart and soul were poured into these quilts as I watched the rebuild, accumulated when I took final picture of the quilts on the porch of the completed home.

I was honored when the Glen Ellen ladies from my childhood invited me to spend a summer learning to hand quilt, a time and technique I will always cherish.

I've never had a stash; I have fabric for each project.

It is written in my wedding vows that my husband Daniel will escort me through quilt shops just as I escort him through nursery's and in this way our marriage and fixed income thrive for going on 5 years.

I love to be inspired by the art created in quilts, and the way people feel loved when they snuggle under them."

## Programs

The April Program on April 19<sup>th</sup> is "5 X 5 from Santa Rosa Quilt Guild". Come and enjoy an evening with fellow quilters from SRQG. 5 quilters will each bring 5 quilts to share. In November, 5 of us Moonlighters visited the day guild with our quilts, and now they are coming to visit us. It was a great time, and I expect this time it will be just as awesome. We'll be joined by Vicki David, Cherie Gooler, Elaine Tucker, Janet Tonkin and Linda Hooper. It will be a treat—I hope I see you all there!

The May Program on May 17 will be via Zoom, with guest lecturer Tammy Silvers.

Tammy comes highly recommended by several MQSC members. Her Zoom lecture is titled "Interrogating Your Quilt". From Tammy: Don't be nice about it – force that fabric to talk to you! Get the real info on how it can work for you to help you achieve your "quilt" vision. This humor-laden lecture focuses on getting the most from your fabric choices and how fabric can (and does) influence the finished quilt! The lecture will be supported by plenty of quilt examples from my retinue of quilts – good and bad!

And for our Zoom workshop on May 20, we will be learning about Faux curved piecing via Tammy's pattern Dutch Windmills. The pattern is designed to work with precuts in three sizes, 5" squares, 10" squares, or Fat quarters/eighths. The size precut you choose will decide the size of the resulting quilt (wall, baby, throw). The pattern requires 20 x 2 pieces, so if you have charm squares or a layer cake, you'll need 40 pieces(2 of each print), plus background and backing. To purchase the pattern go to <u>www.tamarinis.com</u>, where you can also get more information on the fabric requirements and sizes for each quilt.

# Karen Bolan awarded Best in Show!

Congratulations to Karen Bolan for being awarded Best of Show at the 2023 Santa Rosa's The National Arts Program art show. Karen's quilt "Fire" was created in 2020 during one of the two area fires, when her mother-in-law was evacuated and staying in Santa Rosa with Karen and her husband. Karen chose fabrics that reminded her of fire, ash and water. The quilt was started in a class Karen took with Carolina Onto (although she did bend the technique and followed her own path, in true Karen style). It was quilted with straight lines and echo guilting on the curves, and was stretched on a frame rather than traditionally backed, and Karen says she can now call herself an Artist. This was the only quilt that was included in the show, and will be on display at the Finlay Community Center through April 21, 2023.

# **Pacific International Quilt Festival**

From Kerry Mertle, MQSC Member:

Like many of you, I am so disappointed that the show is on hold for now. Here is a copy of Mancuso Show management's letter regarding the PIQF in Oct:

After completing 31 years of the Pacific International Quilt Festival with 28 of those years at the Santa Clara Convention Center, I am sorry to inform you that we have been unsuccessful in negotiating/contracting the Convention Center for our traditional mid-October dates in 2023.

At this time, we are not stating that PIQF has come to an end. Our company is working diligently to find an alternative venue or other acceptable (to us) dates at the Santa Clara venue.

Regarding the Convention Center, the city of Santa Clara signed a multi-year contract on March 18, 2019, with Spectra. This company is a huge conglomerate that manages venues. In a short time, almost all the personnel at the SCCC were let go. These were people who we knew and worked with for many years. In addition, on November 19, 2021, another conglomerate, OVG, purchased Spectra. The transaction needed the approval of the U.S. Department of Justice regarding anti-trust laws. This should give you a clear picture of what we've been left to deal with.

If you are as concerned as we are you may want to contact the following people to express your dismay as well as expressing what PIQF means to you in regards to either your business, your career, and your love for quilting and the textile arts. Your feedback may be instrumental in bringing the show back to the SCCC.
