## Clustered Rings

*Freezer paper foundation piecing...what's that? Sewists who've tried it love it. Freezer paper foundations are sewn beside the folded back seam lines, after which you gently peel the freezer paper foundations away from the work and use the foundation again. (All written instructions support the freezer paper method but these foundations can be used for FQP too.) Because FQP foundations can be reused, I print fewer of them to start. How many times they can be reused depends on several factors. I like to print at least enough to chain-piece a good number at a time. If I need more when they start losing their "stick," I print them. Mary associates foundation piecing with detailed imagery, many pieces, or the sharpest points, but it's also great to use with block-based components like those featured here. (Not all blocks are square!)*

**QUILT SIZE:** 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 72"  
**EQUILATERAL TRIANGLE BLOCKS:** 12" finished each side, not height

### Materials

$\frac{3}{4}$  yard background fabric  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  yard of ring fabric A (light), ring fabric B (medium), ring fabric C (dark)  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  yard binding fabric  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  yard backing fabric  
60" x 78" batting  
Download paper piecing templates at:

I used Essex yarn-dyed linen in Melba (background), Aqua (light), Cadet (medium) and Peacock (dark).

### Cutting

From the **background fabric**, cut:  
2 strips, 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; using template provided, crosscut strips into:  
12 equilateral triangles  
12 half-equilateral triangles

2 strips, 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; crosscut into:  
18 rectangles, 6" x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (BG A)

5 strips, 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; crosscut into:  
60 rectangles, 3" x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (BG B)

5 strips, 5" x WOF; crosscut into:  
60 rectangles, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5" (BG C)

10 strips, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; crosscut into:  
170 rectangles, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "  
(BG D)

7 strips, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; crosscut into:  
84 squares, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (BG A)

6 strips, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; crosscut:  
84 squares into 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (BG B)

From the **light fabric**, cut:  
3 strips, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; crosscut:  
54 rectangles 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

1 strip, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; crosscut into:  
60 rectangles, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

From the **medium & dark fabric**, cut:  
2 strips, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; crosscut into:  
48 rectangles, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles

3 strips, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; crosscut into:  
54 rectangles, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

From the **binding fabric**, cut:  
7 strips, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF
