



Finished block size: 8" by 10" (unfinished is 8 ½" by 10 ½")

Take three rectangles and four snowballs and voila! You have a cat face silhouette! Easy and sooo cute! You'll want to make a bunch of them.

Fabric

- Small pieces of white fabric for the background
- Small pieces of a focus fabric (one fabric, solid or small print)

Cut

- Cut (2) 3 ½" squares of the focus fabric
- Cut (1) 8 ½" wide by 7" tall rectangle of the focus fabric
- Cut (2) 2 ½" squares of the white fabric
- Cut (1) 8 ½" wide by 4" tall rectangle of the white fabric

Sew

1. Make the ears: Draw a line diagonally across the wrong side of the two focus fabric 3 ½" squares. Align the white rectangle with the long side horizontal. Place a marked focus fabric square on the bottom left corner, right sides together, with the line going from top left toward the bottom right of the square. Sew along the marked line. Trim off the lower part of the square, leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Press the focus fabric toward the corner. Repeat for the bottom right corner of the white rectangle, this time with the diagonal line running from top right to bottom left.
2. Make the face: Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of the two white 2 ½" squares. Align the focus fabric rectangle with the long side horizontal. Place a marked white square on the bottom left corner, right sides together, with the line going from top left down to the bottom right of the square. Sew along the marked line. Trim off the lower part of the square, leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Press the white toward the corner. Repeat for the bottom right corner of the focus fabric rectangle, this time with the diagonal line running from the top right to the bottom left.
3. Finish the block: Place the ear unit right side down on top of the face unit, with the ears pointing downward. Sew the two units together using a scant ¼" seam allowance. Press the seam downward.
