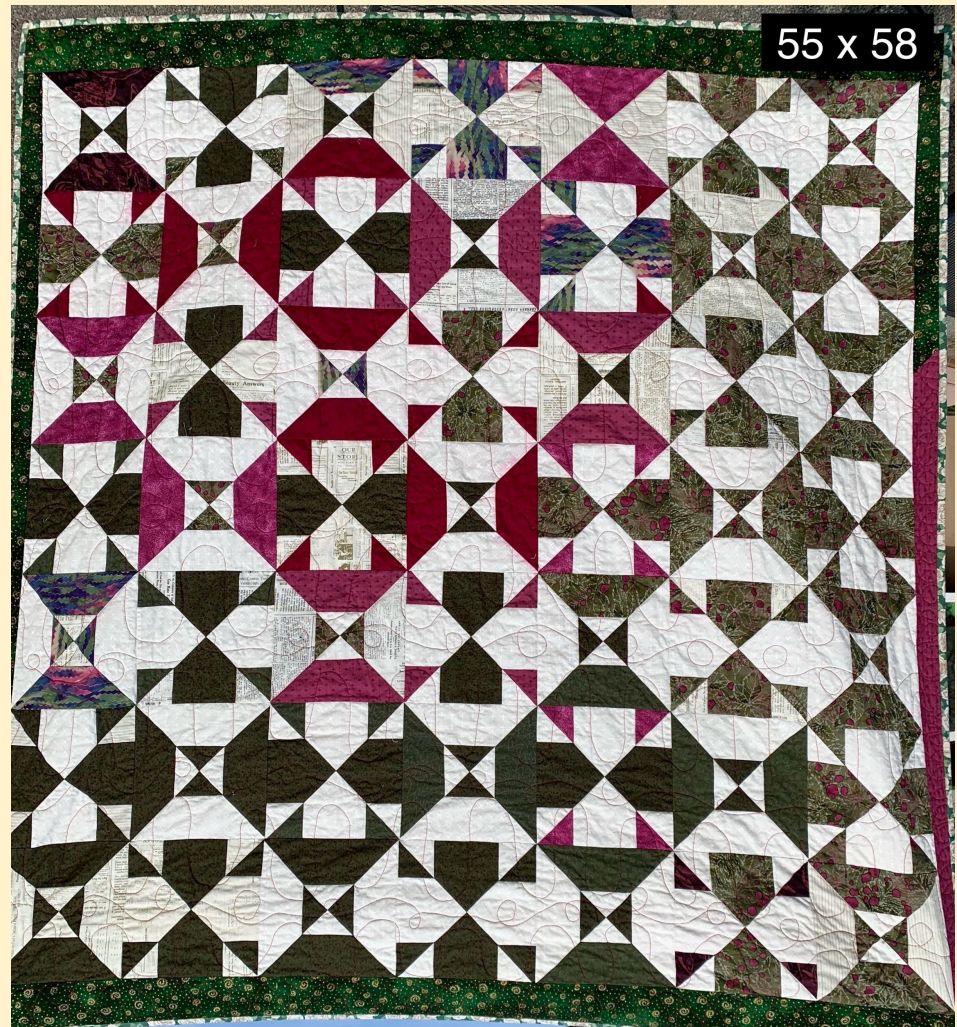

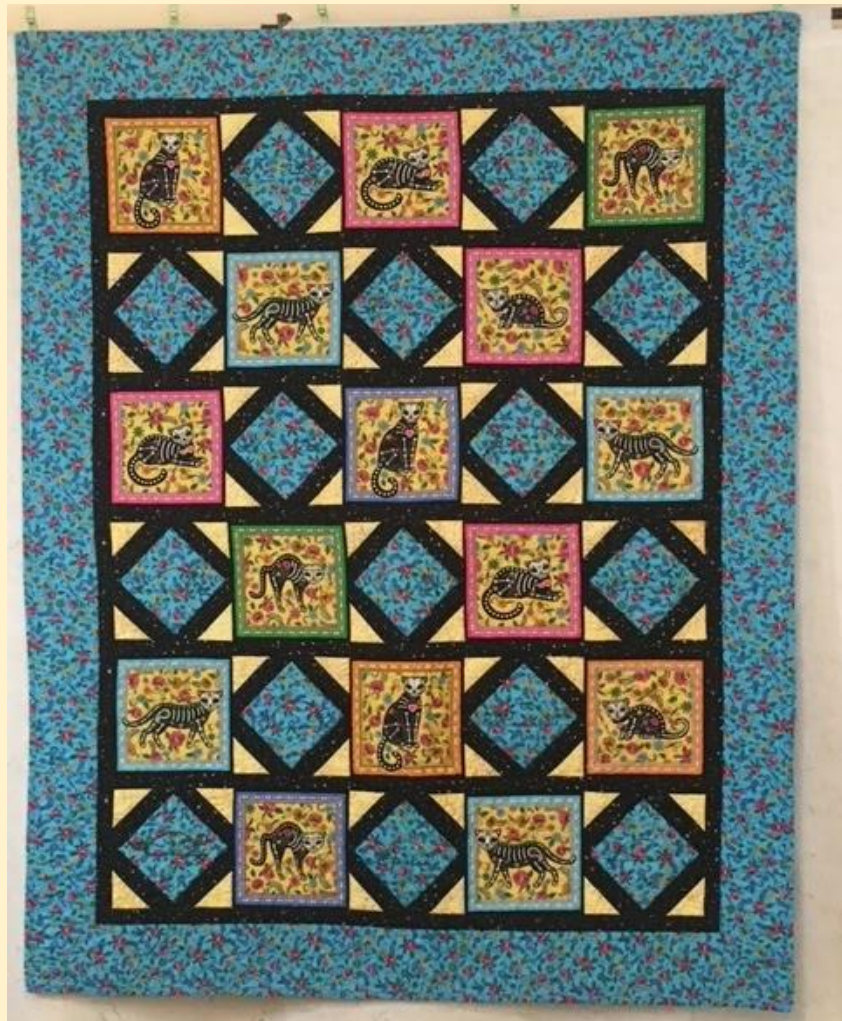

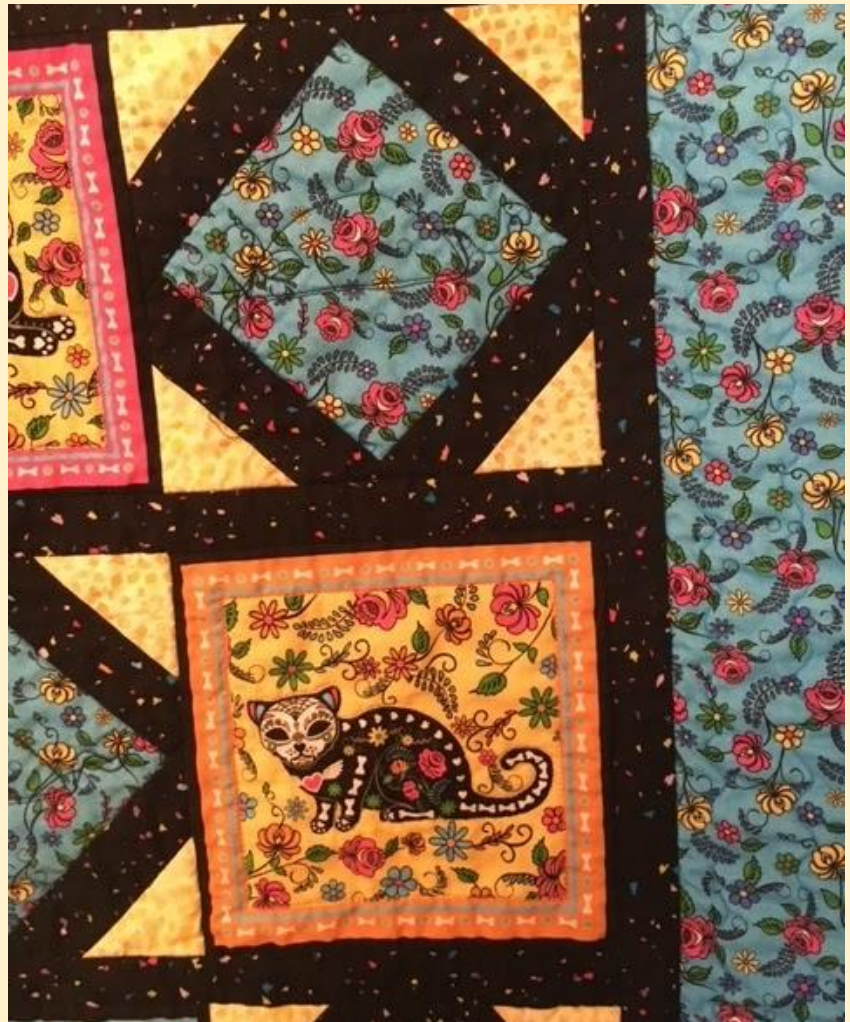
The cats were from a panel I purchased from Equilter. The blue calico is from Village Sewing. I designed this myself. The square in a square was all black at first but was too dark, so I added the yellow snowballs to cheer it up.

I did the quilting, outlining the cats and rectangles. I tried to make rats/mice in the calico but now I know those kinds of designs only show up in solid fabric. The border just uses a stitch on my machine. Since this was going to be a community quilt the binding is also stitched on with a machine stitch.
