Jeanette Walton will be our in-person guest speaker at the August 17th Program Meeting.

Jeanette is a Judy Niemeyer Certified Instructor and an award-winning quilter. As both her grandmother and mother were hand quilters, Jeanette believes quilting is in her DNA. In 2008, she took a class with Judy Niemeyer and quickly fell in love with paper piecing and Judy's patterns. After training with Judy for several years, she became a Certified Instructor in 2014.

Jeanette loves teaching beginners. Her passion is showing beginning students how easy Judy's patterns are to read, how organized the patterns are, and how simple to finish if the steps are followed. Her biggest reward is the satisfaction of seeing amazing works of art from beginning students who said, "I could never do that." In addition to teaching at local quilt shops and guilds, Jeanette enjoys teaching on cruises with Quilt Seminars at Sea, at the Houston Quilt Festival, and Empty Spools Seminars at Asilomar. Although the August 20th workshop was cancelled, there may still be a couple of spots available at the Santa Rosa Quilt Guild "Star Baby" workshop on August 19th. Jane Haworth will be joining us via Zoom for the September 21st Program Meeting discussing her "Journey as a Quilt Artist". She will begin with a short photo tour of Britain and her early, varied career in the textile file and will take us through the trials of teaching herself to quilt, and how she started making unique, raw edge fabric collage quilts. She will also talk about what she has learned from running an Etsy shop and her memory quilt business, along with details of her trip to the International Quilt Festival Dubai.

On September 24th Jane will lead a collage workshop "Sun Lit Sunflowers". Using a variety of fabrics including scraps we will fussy cut and trace shapes and then glue then onto the design before free motion quilting. The quilt can either be finished as a 15" hanging using a binding or stretched onto a 12" artist's canvas.

Workshop cost is \$50 and will include the pattern, and fabric kits will also be available from Jane. Currently this is scheduled to be an in-person workshop, although a site has not yet been selected and the workshop could possibly be done via Zoom. Minutes of the Board Meeting

June 13, 2022 via Zoom

President Linda Lampson called the meeting to order at 7:01 P.M.

A motion to approve the minutes of the March 7, 2022 Board meeting, as posted in the Newsletter on the website was made by Dena Harding, 2nd by Kathy Vedder, and unanimously approved.

President's report – Linda Lampson

Audit committee

- We need an audit committee to review Treasurer's books. This committee needs to complete their work in August and the meeting will be held via zoom.
- General Members that have volunteered are Karen Perlis.
- The President will appoint one more general member

Finance committee

- We need to appoint a finance committee to plan the budget for 2022-2023 year.
 - The committee is made up of the President, President elect, Treasurer, Treasurer elect and three general members appointed by the President.
 - Voting on budget will be done at the September meeting.

Secretary

- We need someone to fill the secretary role.
- The Board appoints vacant positions.

Vice President – Denise Ragozzino

- **VP challenge**, nothing to report
- Vets Building contract
 - The contract has been reviewed for all dates; in person versus Zoom.
 - There are no changes so we will finalize the contract for the calendar year.

Treasurer – Michelle Crosbie

- The audit will occur in August.

Membership – Kathy Vedder and Miriam Marlin

- Renewals, no changes, we are still at 125 members.
- Mini Groups, nothing new to report.

Activities

Programs – Teresa Lewis

- Teresa received samples for the September workshop, she will have kits available for those who want to participate.
- Upcoming workshops
 - The Baby Lone Star workshop is on 8/20/22. The workshop may be merged with the day guild because we don't have a lot of people signed up.
- We have programs scheduled for 9/24/22 with Jane Howarth and 10/22/22 with Sarah Goer.
- We are still looking into renting locations for in person programs.

- The Board decided to increase the fee for programs to \$50; that will be incorporated into next year's budget

Library – Jeanne Nelson

- We don't know if the library will continue for now.
 - If so, need to recruit and appoint coordinators. We don't have any volunteers at this time, so until then, the library will stay in the closet.

Communications – Patricia Bauer and Karen Derrick

- Website functionality. Our current Webmaster is not returning so the role will go back to Karen Derrick. There are several items that may need to be addressed because of this change.
1. Website sign in for meetings will continue
 2. Workshop sign ups.
 - It has not gone as well as we would like for online workshop signups.
 - After discussion it was decided that we will return to paper and email signups for workshops.
 3. Memberships
 - We will continue to have a square device at meetings so people can sign up and pay for membership as well as workshops
 - There may also be an on-line option
 4. Medallions
 - Next year's medallion coordinators are willing to learn how the online medallion sign up works so this can continue
 5. AV coordinator for hybrid meetings
 - Karen Derrick moved to create an AV Coordinator position as part of communication, Teresa Lewis 2nd. The motion carried.
 - Trina Janssen volunteered to be the AV Coordinator and the Board approved her. Linda Lampson will train her.

Show and Tell – Karen Perlis

- There was discussion for how to handle show and tell for those attending via zoom.
 - Do we need to have a presentation online of the quilts? There would need to be someone who takes photos and another to document entries.
 - Theresa Stamey has volunteered to be the person who documents entries presented each night and to coordinate the drawing for a fat quarter.

Community Quilts – Dena Harding

- Quilt Parade
- We have collected about 116 quilts for the quilt parade.
- It was decided to move the quilt parade and the presentation of quilts to the October 5 meetings
- Donating to organizations
 - There was a proposal to add Providence Cancer Center as recipient of our community quilts. If so we may need to look into any size requirements for chemo quilts; they may be different.
 - This will be decided by the guild at a future time
- We will encourage more members to participate in making community quilts.
- County fair
 - Marilyn Lyra and Denise Ragozzino volunteered to judge our award at the County Fair.

Ways and Means – Gina Statler Calhoun

- June Fabric sale and Boutique -\$3984.61, Raffle \$ 1580.00, Boutique 4550.00 (\$682 is our 85%); \$325 direct donation to the boutique says Gina S-C. Opportunity quilt \$3083
- Evaluation
- Gina has heard that people want to go back to the April fabric sale.
- Also people wanted to see quilts.
- Saturday is good; June date is not so good.
- There were not enough volunteers to give relief
- Take into consideration what it takes to hang quilts.
- Definitely worth doing again.
- Opportunity Quilt 2022-2023 construction progress report
- It was decided to reveal the quilt to members at June 15th meeting so the quilt can be displayed at the County Fair.
- Trina moved that the raffle date be September 6th, 2023, Kathy Vedder seconded, motion carried.
- Marketing - need people to take on marketing

Quilt Show

- Discussion was held about whether or not we have the capacity to continue to do the quilt show.
- We don't currently have enough volunteers to put on a show the size of our last ones.
 - We always need someone to volunteer as the chair, plus all the other positions required to lead each team, and then the pool of volunteers to assist.
 - At the July meeting we will present the primary responsibilities, and how many chairs are needed.
- We will consider creating a survey to determine what people want and can commit to and determine a way for people to give anonymous ideas.
- We can consider having it every other year
- We may organize an ad hoc committee to work on this at the July business meeting if there is enough interest to continue. **Review policies for meetings held in person**
