MQSC Annual Fabric Sale

MQSC will be having the annual fabric sale and members boutique on Saturday June 4th, 2022. This is the main fundraiser for the guild this year and we need help from all of our members to make sure the event is a success.

Fabric Sale: It is a great time to go through your stash and purge the fabrics that you no longer want/need. Please keep fabric donations to Fat Eighth or larger. Donations should be dropped off at the Vet's building on Friday June 3rd between 4 and 6pm. Alternate drop offs can be Saturday June 4th between 8 and 9 am, or you may bring to a business guild meeting prior to the sale.

Members boutique: To participate you must be a fully paid member for the year. Items to be sold must be handmade (such as finished quilts, quilt tops, table runners, placemats, doll clothes, etc.) You will need to complete an Inventory Sheet to list your items (you can download from MQSC.org or pick up at a business meeting). The completed Inventory Sheet needs to be handed in to Karla, Nancy Samples, or Dena Harding by May 18 at which time you will be given tags to fill out and attach to your items. Drop off of boutique items will only be on Friday June 3rd between 4 and 6 at the Vets building. Pick up of unsold items will be at the Vets building on Saturday June 4th 4pm.

Raffle Baskets: We are seeking non-quilting items for the Raffle Baskets. Please ask your local businesses to donate items and/or gift cards. Or consider purchasing and donating a gift card yourself. For example, hairdressers, hardware stores, restaurants, Donations for raffle baskets can be brought to any in-person guild meeting. All donations for Raffle baskets need to be in no later than May 18.

Volunteers: We will need volunteers to help bring stuff from the storage area to the Vets building on Friday, and to set up the boutique and room. On Saturday we need cashiers, ticket sellers, people to transport fabric sale items to The Legacy and supplies back to the storage area, clean-up and other jobs.

On April 23 we will gather on Zoom for the Beginning Ruler class with Kellie Kaczmarek of Silly Moon Quilting.

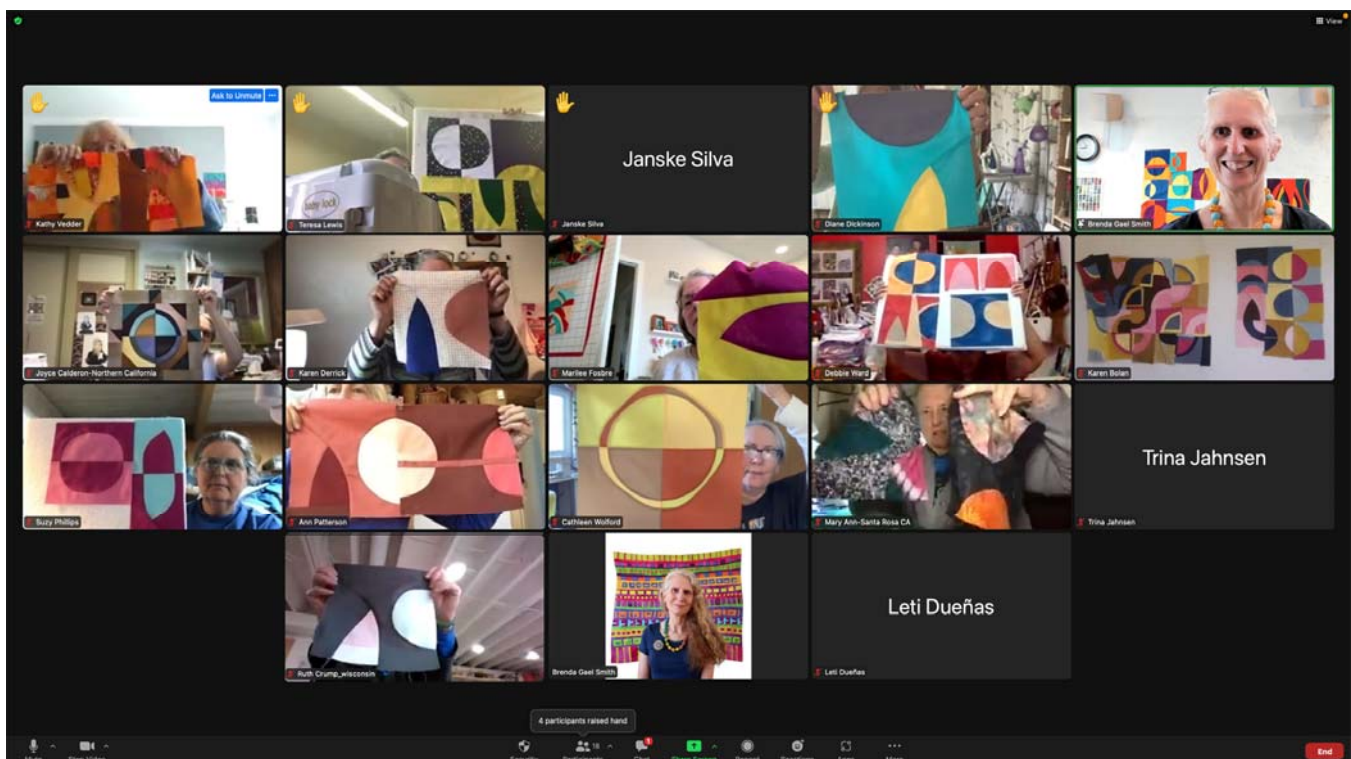
May

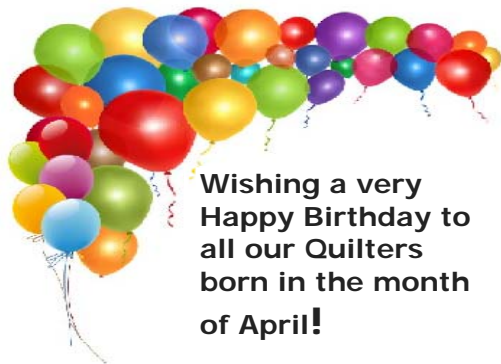

Like many of us in the guild, I started out sewing clothes, although I preferred sewing clothes for my trolls. I loved sewing teddy bears and their clothes, soft dolls, and curtains and couches for my doll house. I embroidered, cross stitched and appliqued. Once I had kids, I made them some clothes, but mostly costumes for Halloween and school plays; now I make costumes for my granddaughters. I have always loved crafts, sewing and stitchery.

In college, I bought a book on making quilts, as it was something both my grandmother and mother did, although their quilts were for practical purposes only and all were made with scraps left over from clothing they had sewn. Although I had wanted to get into quilting, it wasn't until I started hanging out at Handmade Memories in Sebastopol, the quilt shop owned by Nancy and Karla Samples, that I finally took the plunge. Karla told me I was signing up for Marty's beginning class and showed me all the tools I needed to get started. Of course I did what she said and that's when my new hobby began (thank you Karla!). I gave my first quilt to my mom for her 80th birthday in 1999. I was hooked. I continued to take classes and now have made so many quilts I've lost count.

At the beginning I mostly made what I would consider traditional quilts. Now I enjoy McKenna Ryan and Elizabeth Hartman patterns, as well as applique and Sashiko. I also continue to make traditional quilts and lots of baby quilts. I like to mix it up. But the best part of quilting for me, seriously, is the friends I have made. There's nothing I value more than the camaraderie with my fellow quilters, particularly my comrades in the Sisters of Perpetual Quilting! Quilting with my friends both on zoom and in person, after getting vaccinated, saved my sanity during Covid.

My mom, Edith, is no longer with us, but I have to give her a shout out as she was my inspiration in both sewing and quilting; she was an excellent seamstress and an incredibly wonderful woman.
