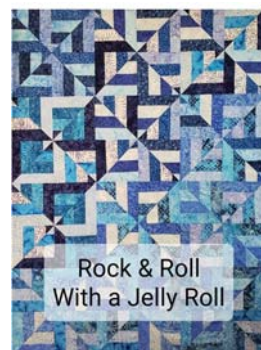


Basic Skills

Be sure to join us at the first In-Person Program Meeting on June 18th. Our guest, Marjan Kluepfel, will be here to speak on the "Evolution of an Art Quilter and Fabric Dyer". Marjan is artist who uses fabric and thread as her medium instead of paper and paint...and a sewing machine instead of a brush". You won't want to miss this!

Unfortunately, the June California the Beautiful landscape class has been cancelled due to insufficient signups. We can reschedule for 2023 if there is enough interest.

Our next scheduled workshop will be in person on **Saturday, August 20, 2022** (location to be determined). Jeanette Walton, a certified QuiltWorx instructor, will be leading us through the Star Baby, a Lone Star quilt. This pattern is fast, easy, and fun! Using only nine strips of 2.5: wide fabric you will sew strip sets, cut apart, rearrange, and sew into a diamond star point. There will be a Zoom pre-class meeting ahead of the workshop where we will get cutting instructions so that all your time on the day of the workshop can be devoted to sewing.

Class fee is \$40 for members (\$45 for non-member). Order the pattern ahead of time at Jeanette's Etsy shop, <https://www.etsy.com/shop/IndigoBlueQuilts>. Use coupon code MQSC2022 for 15% off and free shipping (total pattern cost is \$17.42). Signups for the class are now open on the Programs page of the MQSC Website.

Our guest speakers and workshop instructors for the remainder of 2022 will be Jane Haworth, Sarah Goer and Karen Bolan. These will be in-person workshops so be sure to watch for the signups to open on the QSC Website.
