The videos will be available for 24 hours so if you aren't able to watch live you can catch them on a replay. You will also receive a PDF that includes written instructions to go along with each teacher's demonstration. Come when you can, stay as long as you like. On March 16th Brenda Gael Smith of Serendipity Patchwork & Quilting will join us via Zoom live from Australia to talk about Quilts & Composition, and to give us a Studio Tour. Special Board Meeting by Zoom
Wednesday, February 2, 2022

Members present: Linda Lampson, Kathy Vedder, Teresa Lewis, Miriam Marlin, Carol Simkins, Denise Ragozzino, Jeanne Nelson, Dena Harding, Gina Statler-Calhoun, Trina Jahnsen

The meeting was called to order by President Linda Lampson at 6:00 p.m. A quorum was declared.

The purpose of this special meeting was to determine if the annual Quilt Show as normally presented was financially and otherwise feasible. Quilt Show Committee Chair Trina Jahnsen had presented her concerns by email earlier to the board and had requested guidance, based on information she had gathered by speaking with vendors and organizers of other quilt shows held regionally.

Her concerns:

- 1) Getting enough volunteers
- 2) At both PIQF and Road to California, attendance was about 33-50% of normal, even with fewer Covid-19 restrictions than we have in place in Sonoma County.
- 3) We can expect half the vendors that we normally count on
- 4) We can expect half the boutique income
- 5) There will be no kitchen, no way to feed volunteers or have a resting/breakroom space for vendors and volunteers
- 6) The Guild could lose about \$9,000 under this scenario

Dene Harding noted that in 2019 the volunteer count for the Quilt Show was 189 JUST for the quilt display and vendor areas, equaling 686 hours of volunteer time at the show. In addition, this year we would need additional volunteers to monitor for masks and vaccine compliance.

Alternative – Cancel Quilt Show and offer a Boutique/Fabric Sale/Raffle Basket event. It could be held as a one-day event in the first weekend of June and would include the drawing for the Opportunity Quilt.

Based on this information, Dena Harding moved that MQSC cancel the 2022 Quilt Show as originally planned. Trina seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Following up on this decision, Gina Statler-Calhoun moved that we form committee to plan an alternate event that would be a fundraiser for the guild. Trina seconded that motion and it was unanimously approved.

As a result, Trina will work with Stephanie at the Vets' Memorial Building to change the schedule; vendors and others will be notified of the change in plans. Gina will organize a committee to plan the alternate fundraising event. President Lampson will call for volunteers at the business meeting to be held in a few minutes.

The meeting adjourned at 6:35 p.m.
