Programs



Jane Haworth will be joining us via Zoom for the September 21st Program Meeting discussing her "Journey as a Quilt Artist". She will begin with a short photo tour of Britain and her early, varied career in the textile file and will take us through the trials of teaching herself to quilt, and how she started making unique, raw edge fabric collage quilts. She will also talk about what she has learned from running an Etsy shop and her memory quilt business, along with details of her trip to the International Quilt Festival Dubai.

On September 24th Jane will lead a collage workshop "Sun Lit Sunflowers". Using a variety of fabrics including scraps we will fussy cut and trace shapes and then glue them onto the design before free motion quilting. The quilt can either be finished as a 15" hanging using a binding or stretched onto a 12" artist's canvas.

Workshop cost is \$50 and will include the pattern, and fabric kits will also be available from Jane. Currently this is scheduled to be an in-person workshop, although a site has not yet been selected and the workshop could possibly be done via Zoom. If you would like to register for this class send an email to mqscprograms@gmail.com to be added to the list and bring your payment to the meeting on September 7th. There will NOT be online registration or payment for the workshop.

Sarah Goer will be our speaker in October, with a Zoom presentation at the Program Meeting on September 21st and in-person class on Saturday, October 22nd. Her topic for the program meeting is on color, while the workshop will be Building an Improv Toolbox. In this fast-paced workshop, Sarah will teach a wide variety of improvisational piecing techniques. Discover how fun and easy it is to create the improv elements for use in your existing quilt projects, or as the start of a new project. Each prompt will be introduced and demonstrated, then time will be allowed for making one or more units with each technique.

November will bring Karen Bolan as our guest speaker and workshop instructor, where you will have a chance to design your own modern quilt.

I've enjoyed bringing you a wide variety of programs and workshops for the past year and a half, and look forward to what your new program chair Mary Flynn will be bringing in the next few months.

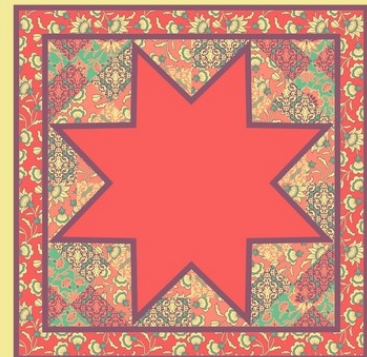


A Message from our VP and soon to be President!

Vice President's report – Denise Ragozzino

- VP challenge is in a month. The topic is Diversity, use the color purple and include a moon.

Treasurer's report – Michelle Crosbie

- We have about \$8,600 in CD account. Net income is \$4475.96 from boutique at fabric sale.
- Let Michelle know if you missed a reimbursement.

Committee/Activity Reports

Programs/Workshops – Teresa Lewis

- Our August meeting will be with Jeanette Walton in person for a trunk show.
- Her workshop has been canceled.
- Any person who wants to attend can join with the SR Quilt Guild on Friday the 19th at the Luther Burbank Garden Center; you can pay at the door.

Fund Raising – Gina Statler-Calhoun

- Fabric Sale and Boutique- final report

- The sale was a success. Fabric sales came to \$3,981.64, raffle was \$1,580.00 with most people buying \$20 worth of tickets. Boutique was \$1,160 net and \$4,550 gross.
- Some feedback is, if we do this again we need to notify people sooner. We didn't get the message out to everyone that needed it. Net income was \$4,475.96, that is after all expenses. \$6575 was total income.
- Thanks to all the people who came out and volunteered.

Quilt Show at the Steele Lane Community Center

- SR Parks and Recreation invited us to do a 10-week quilt show at the Steele Lane Center. We will display our and some of our other products that members have created. Let Gina Stateler-Calhoun know if you want to participate.

Opportunity Quilt marketing

- We will be marketing our opportunity quilt at the Sonoma County Fair and selling tickets. Last year we priced the tickets at \$5 = 1, \$20 = 5 or \$50 = 100 tickets.
- Would like to know what people thought about doing it this way again? The same number of people bought the \$50 as bought the \$20. The majority of the attendees agreed this was okay to continue, Gina will work on getting the tickets made.
- Additional marketing needed, ideally taking the quilt to other venues, other guilds, and all the coordination that goes with it. Open positions are appointed by the Board.

Basic Skills – Pam Brown

- Saturday August 13 with Dena Harding. She will be working on 3-yard quilts based on the Fabric Café books. You can get supplies from Dena the day of or you can pick up your kit from Dena's house.
 - Dena will have several patterns to choose from. Supply list will be sent out via email, sign-up sheet is here tonight or email Pam Brown. The 3 yards does not include the backing. You can donate your quilt if you use your own fabric. If you use one of the kits then it needs to go back to community quilts.
 - Class will be held at the Graton Community Center. Bring your own lunch, no microwave or refrigerator available. It is a good idea to bring a small extra lamp if you have one and a cushion to sit on.
- Quilt parade and donation to charities will be held in October this year.

Medallions – Trina Jahnsen, Dale Yamamura

- Should be turned in by August

- Starts for the new year will be sent out via email blast by Katina.

Quilt Show 2023 – open discussion

For 3 years we have not had a quilt show. Should we continue to have a quilt show?

President Lampson opened the floor for any discussion.

Ideas brought up:

- Don't serve food
- Have a smaller show
- Need an ad hoc group to explore this topic.
 - In the past the quilt show is not designed to be a fund raiser; it is designed to break even.
- If you include a boutique in the fabric sale then that part of the quilt show is covered.
- Concern expressed that we do not have the volunteer capacity to pull off the show
- If we do a smaller show we may lose the vendors who help us to cover our expenses
- For the show chair and others it is a 6–12-month commitment.
- Show brings in all kinds of people that are not part of the guild. Should we have the show to bring in new members?
- Bi laws says that the quilt show is meant to educate the public, one of our purposes stated in our non-profit application
- We provide a lot of education to our members but not as much to the general public
- The Steele Lane event is an outreach event and it is at a time of our new year so the timing is good.
- There are other events that we could be part of that allow us to educate the public, we can conduct this along with other guilds.
- We should get feedback from other guilds about current shows
- Smaller and every other year is a good idea
- Two biggest expenses are the rental of polls, drapes, and the building
- We need to look at a different time, date change, because of the change in the school year.
- If we only do a fabric sale we can do some demonstrations and hang more quilts
- Moving forward we increase our pool of volunteers by making sure people from other guilds are volunteering.
- Our volunteers are aging and they don't want to get on the ladders and do the physical labor.
- Only way to sell quilts or use the boutique is to be a member of our guild, so if someone from another guild wants to sell they are not allowed.

- If we try to do this as a tri guild idea it would need to be very different.
- Focus on doing the fabric sale is where we should use our resources. Add a few elements to the Fabric Sale, such as education, demonstrations, then revisit bringing back the quilt show when we have increased membership or people willing to take on leadership positions.
- If we include other guilds then the profits would need to be split.
- For the Fabric sale consider putting the Boutique on the stage and consider the impact on our local quilt shops
